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Discussion

1. Word of knowledge

We receive words of knowledge from the Holy Spirit which can literally cover a number of things in our daily lives. Explain to your child using different life experiences they have experienced. It can be anything from something very trivial such as misplacing a toy, disagreement with a friend or a problem they couldn't solve and suddenly were able to either find what was missing or solve the problem at hand.

2. Word of wisdom and discernment

Wisdom comes through understanding and applying God's Word to life experiences. In other words, wisdom guides them from unwise decision-making. Wisdom is a gift guided by the Holy Spirit. There are four ways we can teach wisdom in an inviting and practical way.

- Tell stories of individuals in the Bible who made wise decisions and the positive effects that followed. Example: The parable of the wise and foolish builders. (Matthew 7)
- Start them out young by helping them make money decisions. Show them the pattern of "share, save, and spend" from your own financial management. Financial wisdom is a practical gift; whose principles you can use to train your child (Ephesians 6:4).
- Good judgement in choosing friends is another facet of teaching your child the ways of wisdom. Make sure children understand the inclination to be like the people they "hang out with" (Proverbs 13:20). Challenge your children to pray for friends who complement their faith, who move them closer to their heavenly Father. Wise friends rub off on your children in wise ways.
- Discuss with your child regularly the wisdom of God. He gives wisdom (Proverbs 2:6). Read with them from the Bible and discuss the meanings of particular verses. Make the discussion of Scripture a part of your everyday life.

3. Faith

Faith is sometimes difficult for young children to understand. Explain that faith means we believe in God even though we can't see, hear or touch Him. Explain that faith is a decision everyone makes which is believing without seeing, Faith is a gift which requires us to trust God with everything.
